

Did you know that in 2010...

- 200,316 items were circulated from our collections — an increase of 8.9% from 2009.
- Library membership totaled 20,564 — more than 59% of the population of the municipality.
- 436 children participated in the 2010 Summer Reading program — an increase of 3% from 2009.
- The Library offered 718 programs in 2010 and attendance totaled 16,783.
- Public library services cost Whitchurch-Stouffville residents \$24.82 per person annually, or just 7 cents per day!
- Library users can now receive overdue, holds and new item notifications via email.
- The annual “Food for Fines” program held annually during Public Library Week in October provides large donations of food items to the Stouffville Food Bank.

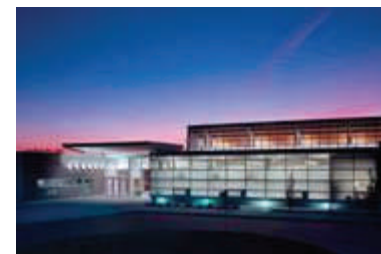

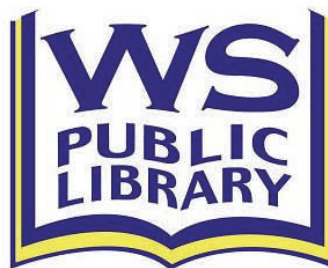

2010 Service Highlights:

- A Self Checkout Unit was implemented to increase customer service levels.
- An Adaptive Technology work station with text to voice capability was purchased with a grant from the Federal government.
- New after-school programs were introduced, including a board game program and a girls' book club.
- A Baby Goose program for 6-24 months-old babies was offered.
- The Library's *Family of the Year* Award was given to the Patel Family for their ongoing support of the Library and its programs.
- A new morning book club was implemented.

Supplementary Sources of Revenue:

- The Library has an aggressive program of grant research and applies for all grants available to library services.
- The Library receives charitable donations from Patrons, Service Clubs and Special Interest Groups (official tax receipts issued).
- Donations and fundraising valued at almost \$30,000 helped supplement the budget to purchase equipment, materials, and program resources.
